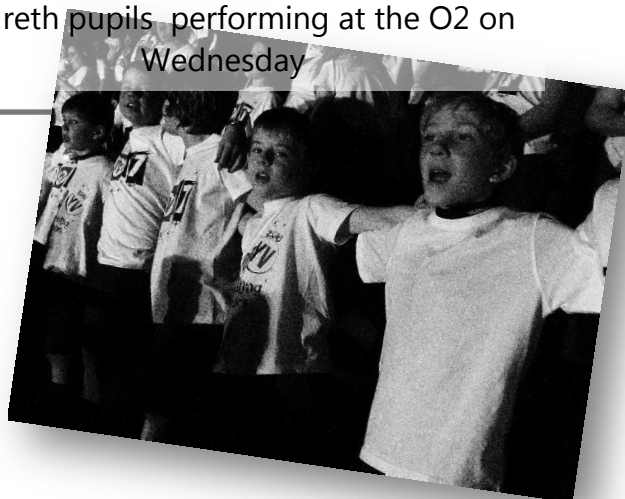

## Competition Time

Mathletics is a great tool for children to practice and consolidate the maths they have learned in school. All children have a log in to use at home and school. To inspire the mathematician within all our children we are launching a **Mathletics Competition**. For every activity the children complete they earn points which will go towards their class total. The class with the most activity points earned by the end of this half term will be awarded a Mathletics games afternoon and the Mathletics Trophy for their class.

By completing Mathletics activities children can also earn individual **bronze, silver and gold Mathletics certificates**. These can be viewed by clicking on 'my awards' on the left side of the home screen.

**1000 points = 1 bronze certificate**

**5 bronze certificates = 1 silver certificate**

**4 silver certificates = 1 gold certificate**



Children who earn a certificate this half term will be presented with it in celebration assembly. Good Luck to everyone taking part. We look forward to celebrating your maths learning next week!!
