<u>Entry Point:</u> Where do you live? Do you live in a village, town or city? What country do you live in? Does everyone's house look the same?

WOW Activity: Class and school survey. Do we all live in Meldreth?



## English:

- o Spell words containing each of the phonemes already taught.
- o Spell common exception words.
- Name the letters of the alphabet in order.
- Use letter names to distinguish between alternative spellings of the same sound.
- o Write from memory simple sentences dictated by the teacher.
- o Composing a sentence orally before writing it.
- Writing simple sentences.
- How words combine to make sentences.
- Leaving spaces between words.
- o Beginning to punctuate sentences using CLs and full stops.

Jay Class will continue our daily Storytime phonic sessions and guided reading sessions will continue.

<u>Maths:</u> We will continue to recap place value within 10 and look at problem solving activities. The children will then begin a unit on addition and subtraction.

Magic 10 will continue with a number bonds to 10 focus.

<u>Science:</u> We will continue to look at senses in science and will introduce weather during this half term.

<u>History & Geography:</u> The children will study their local area, school environment and begin to look at the wider world.

Art & Design: Jay Class will work on creating self-portraits in a variety of media.

Music: Continue to work through the Charanga Music unit 'Hey You'.

PE: Fundamentals and team work unit

**PSHCE:** Continue to work through beginning and belonging unit.
