

All our lessons are taught by your child's class teacher in school or by Swimming Teachers' Association instructors at MVC.

The benefits of our swimming classes go far beyond fulfilling the National Curriculum criteria: they serve to keep children fit, give pupils the opportunity to succeed in a discipline outside the classroom environment, are fun, and most importantly, they teach children how to remain safe in the water. In addition to learning a life skill, achievements are celebrated with certificates which are awarded for completing set tasks in the water. We are always very grateful for **extra assistance offered by parents and carers**, who are able to help during class swimming lessons. Please contact your child's class teacher or office if you can offer help on a regular basis over the next few weeks.

Swimming season is nearly upon us and with it another bag to bring to school. Room in school for storing personal equipment is limited and is the main reason why things go missing is they fall from pegs in cloakrooms.
