## **Pharmacy First.**

Pharmacy First is a new service designed to provide fast, convenient treatment for seven common health conditions, without the need to visit your GP. This initiative allows trained community pharmacists to provide a comprehensive consultation, advice and, when needed, supply prescription-only medicines.

### Which conditions can Pharmacy First help with?

- Sore throat people aged five and over
- Earache children aged one to 17
- Infected insect bite people aged one and over
- Impetigo (a bacterial skin infection) people aged one and over
- Sinusitis people aged 12 and over
- Shingles people aged 18 and over
- Uncomplicated urinary infections women aged 16-64 years

If your child is suffering from one of the above conditions, you can now visit your local pharmacy to receive the necessary treatment without needing to make an appointment. Simply walk into your local pharmacy and ask to talk to a member of the team.

Pupils benefit from dedicated weekly swimming lessons during the summer half term helping them increase their confidence and skills in the water whilst creating happy memories and having fun with their friends.

We are asking each family at school to contribute £25\* a year to help keep the pool running

#### Why the swimming pool needs your support

It is completely funded by the PTA – we receive no funds from school budget or the Local Authority.

The money to run the pool comes from fundraising and support from our school community.

We want to keep our pool for everyone to benefit from now and in the future.

Swimming is a life skill and helps with fitness and mental health. Everyone should have access.

#### Each year we pay for:

- Commissioning & decommissioning
- Oil for heating
- Water testing
- Chlorine and supplies
- Servicing & repairs
- Training for pool carers

Costs vary year to year 2023 = £4000!
