Federation News

This week, the Governing Board held meetings with parents to discuss the federation proposal. Here are some of the questions they asked...

What are the benefits to Meldreth?

Cost savings have meant that:

- an extra member of staff was appointed
- current level of additional support for pupils maintained
- we are futureproofing school form turbulent financial times

Why Federation?

Looking ahead, schools budgets will not sustain the current staffing structure, changes need to be made.

Over past years, Governors have looked at joining an Academy trust and come to the decision that Meldreth leaders and Governors value the autonomy they have as a LA school.

Will this impact Meldreth financially?

School budgets will remain completely separate and we have planned for positive impact; maintaining our current staff structure without redundancies and class changes.

Can my teacher be sent to work at another school?

Class teacher contracts with each school will remain the same. Only leaders will have federation contracts, which will allow them to support other schools if this does not influence classes.

Could we still be forced to academise?

Yes, the DfE can change legislation, but with an existing federation we could consider forming our own primary academy.

Make, Praise & Story @ Meldreth Primary School Thursday 8th May

We welcomed the children and had some biscuits, very necessary after a busy day at school. Then we listened to a parable, which Jesus told people. Parables are stories Jesus used to help people understand something about him as Gods son and about Gods Kingdom. We heard about a tiny mustard seed, which grew into an enormous plant which all the birds of the air could shelter in. This reminds us that God's kingdom started off very small with Jesus and his followers and has spread into something very big and that everyone is welcome to share in this kingdom.

Then we had great fun making our tree and putting birds in it to shelter and be safe. You can pop into Holy Trinity Church, Meldreth to see this tree and if you look very carefully you might be able to find a tiny seed too! We had some little yoghurt pots which had been



covered with paper and the children decorated them. Then we planted sunflower seeds in them. The children took these home to grow on and hopefully plant out in their garden. As they grow they will remind them of Gods kingdom which grows from small beginnings. Also the birds will love the sunflower seeds when they ripen.
