At Meldreth Primary School, we know that reading is about much more than simply decoding words on a page. We encourage our children to actively engage with a wide range of fiction and non-fiction texts to develop meaning, understanding and knowledge of the world around them.

Reading is one of the most important skills your child will learn during their time at school. Reading, listening to and talking about stories and information texts helps to build vocabulary, exposing children to words they may not hear or use in everyday conversation. A strong vocabulary is vital for reading comprehension and supports learning and progress across the entire curriculum. **Enjoy listening to your child read... be their favourite audience!**

Preschool News

This week, both our Butterflies and Caterpillar rooms have been very creative, developing skills across all areas of the EYFS. In Butterflies, group time focused on our winter theme and topic vocabulary, supporting communication and language and leading to a child-led discussion about ice skating. Plans were adapted to follow children's interests, with children learning about ice skating, watching their favourite Disney characters move to music, and creating movements to represent winter weather, promoting physical development and expressive arts and design. Literacy skills shone through as children created Percy the Park Keeper storyboards. The caterpillar's focus was on children's interests to support new children settling in and developing personal, social and emotional skills. Children explored playdough in colours of their choice, cereal sensory play, and explored the new sandpit for the first time.


