Year 6 Science Week Debates

Holiday Free School Meal Vouchers – Easter 2026

Could your child be entitled to a
FREE school meal?



The government's Household Support Fund, which has supported holiday vouchers, will end on 31 March 2026.

To support families over Easter, the Council will continue providing a revised holiday Free School Meal (FSM) voucher scheme until the planned expansion of FSM eligibility in September 2026. Over Easter, vouchers will be issued to families who meet the income-related Free School Meal criteria.

👉 If you think your child may be eligible for [income-related FSM](#), we strongly encourage you to apply. Registering can unlock valuable support, including holiday vouchers and families who are currently paying for school meals will save around £450 a year for each primary school child

Online Safety Information Sessions for Parents and Carers
