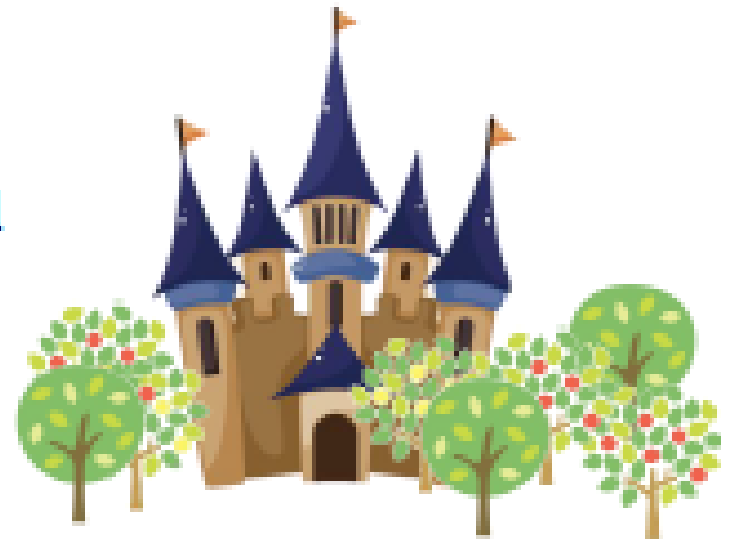
MAGNIFICENT MATHS – Revision
