




From AD 250 to AD 367, the attacks on Britain were becoming more serious. Until then the separate raiders had not worked together. However, in the winter of AD 367, the raiders attacked at the <u>same time</u> — this is known as 'The Barbarian Conspiracy'.

Do you think this made the attack more successful? Why?

The Barbarian Conspiracy

The Scots from Ireland attacked western Britain and the Picts from Scotland attacked Hadrian's wall. Some of the Roman soldiers based there deserted the army and joined the Picts as they forced through the gates. At the same time, Saxon raiders attacked and pushed past the forts on the coastline and headed into the southern cities. Spies that were supposed to inform the Romans of attacks, also decided to rebel and joined the Saxons.



Rebelling and raiding

The Roman soldiers started to rebel because of their poor food and poor pay. Many slaves took this as their chance to escape. They grouped together to burn down farms and villas and robbed and killed the people who lived there. Britain was in chaos.

What do you think the Roman leaders did about this?

A downward spiral


The Roman emperor of the time, Valentinian, sent some commanders to bring <u>order</u> back to Britain. Eventually the <u>invaders</u> were <u>driven out</u> and Hadrian's wall was re-strengthened.

However, over the next 40 years, things became worse and worse in the Roman Empire — it couldn't pay its soldiers or feed its people and it was being attacked from many different points.

Around AD 400, the Roman army left Hadrian's wall for the last time. By AD 410, the Roman army had left Britain.

How do you think the people in Britain felt about this?

After the Roman army left, the raiders moved in. This time the people of Britain didn't have anyone to help them <u>defend</u> themselves.



Saying farewell to Britain

The <u>attack</u> by many groups of raiders on Britain had a big effect on the Romans.

Many soldiers were <u>fed-up</u> and joined the attackers instead of fighting them.

Eventually the Roman army was called back to Rome leaving Britain to <u>fend for itself...</u>

The Barbarian Conspiracy happened in the winder of AD 367.




The map below shows where the tribes attacked from the Barbarian Conspiracy.

Creative Task

MAKE A ROMAN STANDARD



- ▲ I. Draw an eagle shape like this on a piece of card and cut it out carefully. It should be about twice as wide as the paper plate.
 - 2. Draw round the paper plate on to card to make a crescent shape and cut it out.



▲ 3. Carefully cut the flat middle from the paper plate, making sure to cut the outer ring in only one place.



▲ 4. Paint all the cut-out pieces and the pot-plant stake gold. Paint a piece of paper gold on both sides and cut out lots of leaf shapes. Stick them on to the ring from the paper plate to make a laurel wreath.

You will need: a garden cane at least I metre long • cardboard • a pencil • a pot-plant stake • a paper plate • paper • a piece of red or purple cloth • scissors • sticky tape or glue • gold paint



▲ 5. Hang the red or purple cloth from the pot-plant stake. You can fray the bottom edge and paint it to make a gold fringe if you like. Use sticky tape to fix all the pieces one under the other on the cane.
