A huge thank you to parents and pupils for the standard of school uniform this term, despite the lack of available shops. If you are thinking of upsizing to your next school uniform before the summer holidays or dressing in cooler summer uniform, please bear in mind our guidance:

- *White or Green Polo shirt
- *Green jumper or cardigan
- Charcoal trousers or shorts with grey socks (knee or ankle length, not trainer socks)
- Charcoal skirt/pinafore with grey tights or white or grey socks (knee or ankle length, not trainer socks)
- Green check summer dress
- Waterproof coat
- Black 'school' shoes with a good grip and proper support (no sandals, trainers, crocs or boots)
- A second pair of shoes/wellies for woodland learning if requested
- Our safety rules do not allow jewelry and nail polish in school, other than **small earring studs** or a watch in KS2.
