PHONICS

So far, we have looked at the split digraphs a-e, o-e and i-e. This week we are going to be learning about u-e and e-e. u-e can make both a 'yoo' and an 'oo' sound like the words cube and rude. The e-e split digraph makes the sound 'ee' like the words even and theme.


MATHS - addition within and up to 10
