Summer Uniform

- white or dark green polo shirt, or white blouse
- dark grey trousers, skirts or shorts (no leggings please)
- green and white check or striped summer dress
- flat, dark shoes or sandals with a good grip and proper support (no flip-flops or crocs please)
- Jewellery and nail polish are not permitted in school. The exception to this rule are small earring studs or a watch in KS2.

School Attendance

Meldreth Primary School is committed to 100% attendance. However, we recognise there are times when your child cannot attend school - when they are ill or they have an unavoidable appointment. Missing school regularly can severely affect a child's success and to this end we track your child's attendance carefully and **will contact you and meet with you if your child's attendance falls below 95%.**

The legal position is clear: parents do not have the right to take their child out of school for holidays during term time. **By law, you must ask permission for your child to miss school** and if you still go away on holiday you will be referred to the County Education Welfare Officer and may risk receiving a £60 penalty notice per parent per child and/or prosecution.

MEASLES

Don't let your child catch it

– get them vaccinated with the MMR vaccine

- measles outbreaks happen when not enough children have been vaccinated
- measles can be a very serious disease, leading to ear and chest infections, fits, diarrhoea, and damage to the brain. Measles can kill
- your child is at risk of measles if he or she hasn't had the MMR vaccination
- 2 doses of MMR vaccine are needed to get the best protection
- if your child is due to have had 2 doses of MMR but has not yet received them, no matter what age they are, you should contact your GP to get them vaccinated as soon as possible*
- if you can't remember if your child has had any, 1 or 2 doses of MMR vaccine, check his or her personal child health record (the Red Book). If this doesn't help, speak to your GP
- if you don't know how many doses your child has had, it's better to have 2 doses of MMR vaccine now rather than risk leaving them unprotected

*In response to a local outbreak then the 2 doses can be given one month apart from the age of 18 months.
