



Londinium	This was the Roman name for London.	Julius Caesar was probably the best known Roman leader. He extended the empire by invading other lands.
conquer	To overcome and take control of people or land using military force.	Boudicca was a queen of the British Celtic Iceni Tribe who led an uprising against the occupying forces of the Roman Empire.
invade	Enter a place or land with the intention of occupying it.	A legend tells that Rome was created by two brothers, Romulus and Remus who were abandoned after they were born.
Romanisation	When the countries that the Romans conquered became very much like Rome.	☐ Romans used to eat food like dormice dipped in honey.
Celts	People living in Britain at this time.	Romans occasionally used a spoon, but they would never use a knife and fork. Rich Romans liked to eat exotic food, such as stork, roast parrot and even flamingo!
Caledonia	The name used in Roman times for Scotland.	☐ When the Romans came to Britain they created the first roads in Britain, introduced coins to the land and introduced a written language (Latin).
