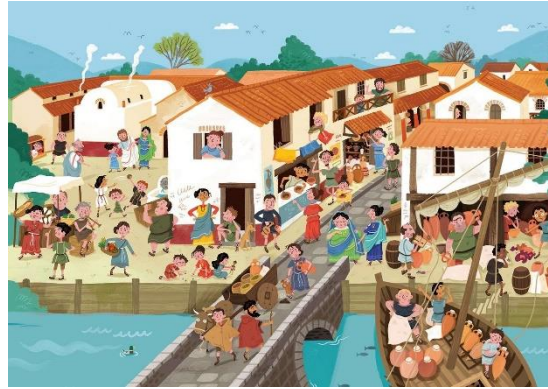

## Subject Specific Vocabulary

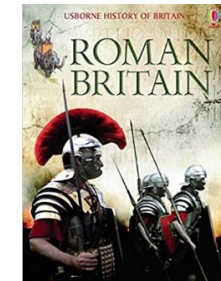
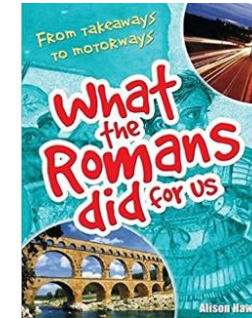
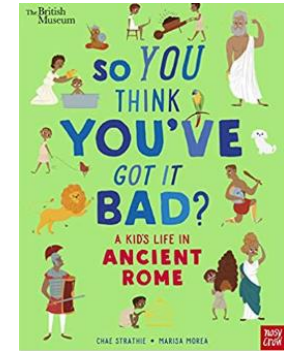
<b>centurion</b>	A commander of a group of 100 Roman soldiers.
<b>emperor</b>	The Roman leader of the Roman Empire during the imperial period.
<b>aqueduct</b>	A large system, like a bridge, for carrying water from one place to another is called an aqueduct.
<b>Iceni</b>	A tribe of Celts who lived in the east of Britain.
<b>Londinium</b>	This was the Roman name for London.
<b>conquer</b>	To overcome and take control of people or land using military force.
<b>invade</b>	Enter a place or land with the intention of occupying it.
<b>Romanisation</b>	When the countries that the Romans conquered became very much like Rome.
<b>Celts</b>	People living in Britain at this time.
<b>Caledonia</b>	The name used in Roman times for Scotland.



## Sticky Knowledge about the Romans

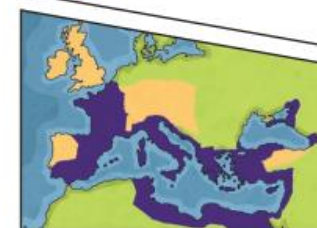
- ☐ Julius Caesar was probably the best known Roman leader. He extended the empire by invading other lands.
- ☐ Boudicca was a queen of the British Celtic Iceni Tribe who led an uprising against the occupying forces of the Roman Empire.
- ☐ A legend tells that Rome was created by two brothers, Romulus and Remus who were abandoned after they were born.
- ☐ Romans used to eat food like dormice dipped in honey.
- ☐ Romans occasionally used a spoon, but they would never use a knife and fork. Rich Romans liked to eat exotic food, such as stork, roast parrot and even flamingo!
- ☐ When the Romans came to Britain they created the first roads in Britain, introduced coins to the land and introduced a written language (Latin).
