

## MATHS – L.O.: to measure capacity and volume using ml and l.

Let's look at the standard units – millilitres, written as ml and litres, written as l.  
Use different containers that are labelled with litres (e.g. water bottle, fizzy drink bottle, various jugs) and smaller containers, to investigate how many smaller containers it would take to fill the bottles measured in litres.

For example: ten 100ml containers will fill a 1 litre water bottle.

You can repeat using different containers and record your findings in a table (see below).

## ENGLISH

L.O.: to write a story.

Write a story about having a dragon as a pet.

Think about your story structure.  
Do you have a clear beginning, middle and end?

Try to use addition and subtraction. Can you use multiplication?




# Throw Tennis

## Home Physical Education

### How to play:

- Mark out a tennis court. Use a rope as a net or socks as the court markings.
- Playing against an opponent can you underarm throw a ball into a space on your opponents side of the court.
- If the ball bounces twice you score a point, but if you throw it out of the court your opponent wins a point.
- Make sure that you start the game by serving from the back of the court.
- The first player to score 10 points is the winner.

Are you on the balls of your feet ready to receive the ball? Make sure you have your hands ready to catch!


Choose a container that is measured in litres. Choose a container that is measured in millilitres.
