Discretionary Payments for Isolation

Parents and carers of children who have been advised to self-isolate by their education setting or by NHS Test and Trace are now able to apply for a **Test and Trace Support Payment or discretionary payment of £500**, if they meet the eligibility criteria. Hair, Accessories and Hats

For health and hygiene reasons, **long hair should always be tied back.**

Hair accessories should be practical and conform to school colours (neutral, white, grey, green).

A wide brimmed sun hat or sports cap is actively encouraged for sunny weather and outdoor PE.

Only one pair of **small plain stud earrings** is permitted for safety reasons which must be removed by your child for PE and should be stored safely (a named, lidded container works well). If a child is unable to remove earrings then these must be removed at home on PE days.

No other jewellery, nail varnish or make up is permitted (unless for verifiable religious or health reasons).



Rapid testing at home is now available for all adults without symptoms.

Up to 1 in 3 people who have Covid-19 have no symptoms.

By taking regular tests you can help to reduce the spread of the virus and help those around you stay healthy and safe.

If you would like to share a treat on your child's birthday, please bring, preferably individually wrapped, treats to the gate at the end of the school day to be given out by your child.
