Families who are currently paying for school meals will save around £450 a year for each primary school child if they are entitled to free school meals.

- It is impossible for other pupils to know who is receiving free school
- Children who are eligible for free school meals are entitled to a twocourse meal worth £2.50.
- When you apply for free school meals, school will receive Pupil Premium - extra money to support children
- If your child is in receipt of <u>universal infant free school meals</u> (where your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2), please apply if you think you may be eligible for free school meals.
