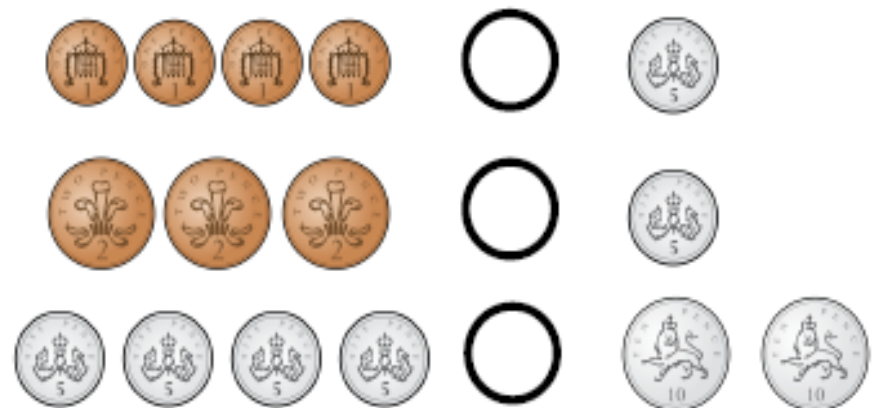


Activity 1 - Draw coins to show the given amounts
