We will continue to promote to our younger pupils how our staff, play leaders and peer mediators can help them at play.

We will continue to promote our 'NO, GO, TELL' message, where children learn that better communication with their peers support better behaviour especially when play breaks down. We are aware that we need to make further improvements in how the school communicates the social and emotional support for our learners.

Our response

We have been aware through previous surveys that some of you feel that improvements need to be made in how we communicate the progress of learners. Our redesigned class pages show end of year expectations and we have restructured our parent consultation meeting to better align with our termly assessment for pupils, after which we share a termly report.

The way we assess pupils is explained on our website and can be accessed here. Puffin class pupils can now access our observations through Tapestry and can contribute to assessment too. We will continue to investigate how we can support you in better understanding your child's progress and hope that with greater information about how school measures progress parents will be better equipped to discuss this with staff. We will be looking at other ways of providing information to parents, other than those currently available, such as information at Parent Consultations events.
