Reading Task

Write 4 questions about your book so far. You must write down the answers as well.

RE Task

A special place for people who follow Judaism is a place called Jerusalem. Jerusalem is the ancient capital of Israel and is, therefore, very special and important to Jewish people.

- Jerusalem is also where the first Jewish temple was built and the Western Wall from this temple still remains there.
- The temple was where Moses brought the Ten Commandments to when he came down from Mount Sinai. He placed them in a special golden box called of Ark of the Covenant.
- Jewish people like to make pilgrimages to this wall.



As well as Jerusalem, Jewish people also have special buildings where they can go to worship. These buildings are Synagogues.
