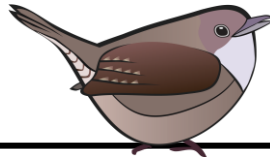

It's Nature Detective Thursday!

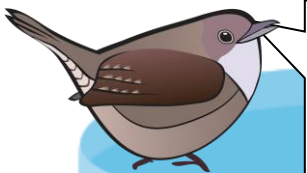
We are looking at mythical beasts but during Nature Detectives minibeasts are more our style.

All About Bog Things

Introduction

A Bog Thing is a magical, wild creature. It is difficult to find and very rarely seen.

What Does a Bog Thing Look Like?

A Bog Thing is a small, round, blue creature. Some Bog Things have pointy, pink stars on their backs. They have tiny ears and large eyes. A few Bog Things also have fluffy wings.



Where Does a Bog Thing Live?

Bog Things live in ponds and rivers. They like to hide under rocks, stones or shells. They always choose homes near weeds and reeds so that they can hide from predators.

How Do Bog Things Move?

Bog Things are good at swimming. They can also use their tail to help them to swing through reeds. Bog Things cannot fly.
